

- New or Enhanced Bike Lanes on Mowry, Mission, Warren




Upcoming



Must Have FasTrak Flex®

- 3+ people: FREE
- 2 people: HALF TOLL

All Drivers
Must Have FasTrak®

- Clean Air Vehicle (CAV): HALF TOLL
- 1 person: FULL TOLL

Motorcycles are FREE with a FasTrak Flex toll tag set to 3+.

Clean Air Vehicles pay half-price tolls with a FasTrak CAV tag.


