EMERGENCY ORDER AND DECLARATION OF THE CITY MANAGER/DIRECTOR OF EMERGENCY SERVICES PROVIDING FOR THE CLOSURE OF CERTAIN STREETS AND ENDING THE CURFEW

WHEREAS, under the authority of state law and Fremont Municipal Code Chapter 2.20, I declared a local emergency on June 1, 2020, which was ratified by the City Council on June 2, 2020; and

WHEREAS, upon the proclamation of a local emergency I am empowered to issue emergency orders and impose rules and regulations for the protection of life and property, and which are necessary for the City to prepare for and respond to the threat and actual incidents of civil unrest, looting, and violence in the City; and

WHEREAS, based on the findings contained in the emergency proclamation and the recurring and fast-evolving conditions which continue to pose a threat to the safety and health of persons and also property within the City; and

WHEREAS, time is of the essence and these conditions are or are likely to be beyond the control of the services, personnel, equipment, and facilities of the City;

NOW, THEREFORE, I ORDER AND DECLARE that the following road closures authorized under a previous emergency order, will remain in place through June 8, 2020 during the hours of 8 p.m. and 5 a.m.

Road Closures - Pacific Commons

Christy Street, south of Auto Mall

Pacific Commons Blvd, from Auto Mall to Bunche Drive

Boscell Rd, from Auto Mall to Bunche Drive

Cushing Parkway, from Auto Mall to Bunche Drive (both directions)

Nobel Drive, from Auto Mall to Bunche Drive

1. A violation of this order may be punishable as a misdemeanor in accordance with state law or pursuant to Fremont Municipal Code Chapter 1.15. This order also may be enforced through the issuance of administrative citations pursuant to Fremont Municipal Code Chapter 1.20.
2. This order does not apply to law enforcement personnel, firefighters, first responders, emergency health care providers, civilians officially engaged in responding to the emergency, persons traveling to and from work or for medical reasons, persons impacted by homelessness, and authorized representatives of a news service, newspaper, radio or television station or network.


3. This order does not prohibit or supersede other authorities under state and local law that provide for the closure of streets and enforcement of those laws.

I FURTHER ORDER AND DECLARE that the curfew imposed on June 1, 2020 is hereby terminated, effective 5 a.m. on June 5, 2020.

I FURTHER ORDER AND DECLARE the law enforcement personnel of this City along with other law enforcement agencies cooperating with the City are authorized and charged with the duty to enforce this order, and are further authorized to issue warnings, cite, arrest, or take other appropriate measures to stop violations and after due notice, oral or written, has been given to the person. This order shall be enforced in accordance with law.

I FURTHER ORDER AND DECLARE that this emergency order and any orders and regulations issued during the local emergency shall receive widespread publicity and notice.
