4.1 FY 2020-2022 CDBG Funding Process

The FY 2020-2022 funding process for the Community Development Block Grant Program is underway. The deadline to submit proposals was January 23, 2020. Staff received eleven Community Development Block Grant Project proposals via ZoomGrants:

- Seven (7) Capital Project proposals, totaling \$3,471,386 for FY 2020-2021 and \$250,000 for FY 2021-2022
- Three (3) Microenterprise proposals totaling \$130,000 for FY 2020-2021 and \$130,000 for FY 2021-2022
- One (1) Housing Public Service proposal totaling \$118,743 for FY 2020-2021 and \$118,743 for FY 2021-2022

Staff estimates there will be approximately \$1,180,000 available for FY 2020-2021 for capital and microenterprise projects and \$113,300 available for housing public service projects.

Citizens' Advisory Committee (CAC) Members and staff independently reviewed the proposals and prepared questions for the agencies. The responses from agencies were received by February 18, 2020.

5. NEW BUSINESS

5.1 FY 2020-2022 CDBG Funding – Interviews for Applicants

CAC Members and Staff interview applicant agencies according to a pre-determined interview schedule. Each agency is given 10 minutes with the interview panel. Agencies have an opportunity to present their proposed program during the first five minutes of the interview, followed by another five minutes of questions and answers to further clarify their proposal. Each agency may bring a maximum of three representatives from their agency. The interview schedule is below:
