

Dear Mayor Mei and Members of the Fremont City Council,

We are sending this message on behalf of a citizen-organized group called "Friends of the Navigation Center". Our group was formed to advocate that the HNC be approved and completed as quickly as possible, at either of the proposed City sites, without further delay.

We urge that you strictly adhere to your self-imposed September 2019 deadline for final site selection, in order to meet the mid-2020 time-frame and ensuring the City doesn't lose \$2 million per year in State HEAP funding for operating the HNC. This urgent crisis deserves immediate action--each day of delay is one day longer that homeless residents suffer on our streets without a pathway to permanent housing.

Please accept into public record, an **organizational petition**, whereby a collection of community service, housing, environmental, and faith-based advocacy groups have all reiterated their support for a Housing Navigation Center in Fremont.

During the September 10th City Council Hearing, we are expecting a large group of supporters who will be advocating in a respectful, civil manner, as befits the dignity of our great City. However, we have deliberately limited the number of our own speakers during the Public Comment phase (and urged our supporters to do the same).

This gesture is meant as a sign of respect for the time of our City Councilmembers, and to allow time for deliberation. We hope our silence will not be construed as a lack of support or enthusiasm.

We are writing to share our **strong support** for the City's plans to build a Homeless Navigation Center in Fremont.


Thank you for acknowledging the need for providing services to support our unhoused neighbors. As a Compassionate City, we understand that the current shelter crisis is a threat to the safety and well-being of those experiencing homelessness. We applaud the City's methodical process for narrowing down potential sites, and for recognizing that the Navigation Center is an important pathway toward permanent housing. In making your final decision, we urge City Council to:

1. Strictly adhere to your self-imposed September 2019 deadline for final site selection, in order to meet the mid-2020 timeframe for opening the Navigation Center. This urgent crisis deserves immediate action--each day of delay is one day longer that homeless residents suffer on our streets without a pathway to permanent housing.
2. Choose a site that is best for residents experiencing homelessness. Either site will help alleviate the suffering experienced by our neighbors. Fear, misinformation, or discrimination against people experiencing homelessness are not relevant criteria. By moving forward with this project, you are sending a strong signal that this is not tolerated in Fremont. The Navigation Center should be part of the Fremont community to support integrating Navigation Center residents into the neighborhood.

We urge ALL members of the City Council to show true leadership to ensure that the Navigation Center becomes a reality.

Ladies and Gentleman of the City Council and Staff who are the decision makers for the HNC.

This is your time. You are making history in our city. We are making history.

I've had the pleasure of talking with many of you. Some in person, some by email, and now I'm talking with you in this letter. Thank you in advance for taking the time to read this brief message. The city council meeting will not be conducive for me to address you. There's clearly too much to say in such a brief and hurried manner that I'll have to pass on standing up to the microphone during the meeting. May you please take this letter and review some of my ideas in place of me addressing you in person tomorrow night. May you please consider these points in making your decision regarding the HNC.

While the concept of the proposed HNC is being explained in ways for a newcomer to understand, an easy way to grasp this is that it's essentially a motel. It's a motel that has extra services for those with special needs, but it's nothing more than a motel. And while it may have some wonderful benefits, you're thinking of dropping this motel directly in the heart of downtown which I feel will be detrimental. This downtown is where I live. It's my front door. And because of my knowledge of this area, I am qualified to speak to you about this. I live, shop, work and play in downtown. This just isn't The City Hall Parking Lot, it's our up-and-coming downtown. I'm a real estate agent who works in the sales offices of new home communities. I sell new homes throughout the entire Bay Area. I'm familiar with our neighboring cities. I know the market from high rises in the city, to condos in Hayward, to estates in Los Gatos. I've worked at Locale, Patterson Ranch, The Landing West, and many other new home communities from Daly City to Tracy. I know a lot of the builders, the agents, and I know who the buyers are in the Bay Area. I also know many of the business owners and managers in downtown. A lot of people respect me and appreciate my knowledge.

Regarding the HNC, I've heard some of you say that residents and business owners are expressing too many emotions. I've heard you say that you've heard enough of us talking about our feelings. I've heard some of you say that facts and figures are only important. Yet I'm here to tell you that perhaps the most important part of what you should be considering is how people feel, and this is what I'm expressing to you today. For what you're making a decision on cannot be analyzed like it's a math problem. There is not a formula that one can use. Strict adherence to data and facts are not the correct methods you should be using. While certainly the details regarding numbers, ie money, are critical, you're not going to clearly understand this situation without the feelings and emotions that must come in to play. This is about people.

Please take a few minutes considering some of my opinions, and please pay attention to how you feel as you read this. Take these ideas and let them stay in your heart today and tonight. Tomorrow you may be ready to decide with your emotions coming in to play.

Pets.

Dogs need to be walked. They need exercise, social time, and of course areas for their business. Point to me where this will occur downtown. Show this to me. Draw on the map where this will be a good place for the dogs and owners to go. I'm curious as to where this will take place. Walk to those places downtown where this will not be a bother to businesses or to others who live in the area. There isn't any place. There is no extra land for this to occur. And I'm here to tell you, there is a high probability that the owners of these dogs may not be the most respectful and conscientious dog people. Will the pets always be leashed, non-aggressive, cleaned up after and well cared for? Maybe, and maybe not. This brings up a lot of emotions. Many of the residents now in the Bay Area do like dogs. No one wants to deal with an aggressive animal. No one wants to step in dog's waste. Downtown is not a good place for this strictly for the fact of it not being a good area for a lot of dogs.

Loitering or Living. Now they're "sanctioned".

Right now the homeless are asked by police to move along and not stay around certain areas. Many areas are private property and are therefore areas whereas we have a right to have them leave. And we have that right. But think about this. If you're in the program, then you have an assigned bed and storage locker. This becomes your address. Even though you know it's temporary, you're now living in a home where you belong. You now have a right to be here. You are home. Yet look at this problem. Where do you go to spend your time? You can't hang out on your bed all day. You can't hang out in the little social area all day. You can't hang out in front of Raley's. There's no place over at Whole Foods, and you're not welcome at the Hub. You'll be bothered all over downtown. And yes, some will be going to work. But what about on the days off, in the evenings, or those who can't, or won't be working. We hear, "They are already here." as justifying that we should allow them to have an officially sanctioned place, but where are we going to make them feel comfortable downtown? Can you honestly point to a place where this will happen? How does that make them feel? Not good.

The magnet effect.

We hear a lot of talk that the Magnet potential will not happen. Meaning that more homeless will not start increasing. This is wrong. We all need others. We need companionship. For those in the program and not, friends will make more friends. Whether it's for good or bad, we will see more homeless in the area. It's inevitable. When those who are accepted into the program and staying at the HNC, if it comes downtown, they will go out and socialize. And if you're honest, I think we can confidently say that they will not be socializing with those who live at Locale, or going over to the Cine Lounge and watching a Bollywood movie, or strolling over to eat at The Counter. They will be spending time with those who they have in common. Also, if someone comes up to the gate who's not had a shower in a month, or seriously needs to use the restroom or who's starving, don't you think it makes sense that someone will let them in "just one time". We've all pleaded to be let into a bathroom because it's an emergency. And the soft-hearted staff member will of course bend the rules from time-to-time. And naturally we want to help everyone who needs it. There will be those showing up at the gate asking for assistance. While they will be turned away most times, we'll all want to help when people show up. This is the goal. Think about this.

Temptations.

What are some of the biggest temptations for those who have mental illness and/or substance abuse issues? There are lots of choices downtown in which to buy alcohol. Stores will be just a few steps away in any direction. Yes, social security and Tri-City Health is close by, but look at what else is close by that is much more of a draw, and potentially much more dangerous.

Hostility.

Jim Griffin made an excellent point. There is great deal of hostility that we feel towards the homeless in this city. Fremont has a different culture than other areas. This may actually get worse over time instead of getting better and this is because of several factors. One certainly is where we're starting. Already the area in downtown has experienced too many problems. Again just to be honest, the two main cultures of those who live downtown do not have the patience for the homeless.

Deaths at WF. Major scrutiny.

You talk about a microscope and how closely we're going to be watching. Imagine how much we'll all be paying attention if the HNC comes in. The recent deaths of two homeless people near Wells Fargo went primarily unnoticed, but that was then. My gosh, that would be major news if it happened again, or anything deemed to be a threat to public safety or to negative impacts on

businesses. The media will be all over the problems and undoubtedly stories will be exaggerated. You won't be able to contain stories as emotions over such issues will be running way too high. The new groups and new friendships that have formed recently will be relentless. They may not have become as well organized in the Downtown area as compared to the Decoto area, yet I think we can all agree that should the HNC go in downtown, there will be more of a cohesive unit. Feelings get running high which can spur more "togetherness".

Noise.

Washington hospital recently opened up their new emergency and trauma care building. They're needing to fill this facility. Clearly they need patients and they need ambulances delivering patients. Kaiser expanded their emergency room a few years ago. The reason to mention this, is that downtown experiences a lot of sirens. You don't notice this if you're busy in the building or not spending a great deal of time downtown. But let me tell you, try living here now. You would be amazed at the level of sirens we have in this area. I predicted this a couple years ago before the trauma center opened and it's come to pass. With the fire station next to the Hub on Mowry, the police department close on Stevenson, Kaiser, Fremont Hospital, and Washington Hospital, we don't go half a day without some emergency sirens blaring. And there are times when they overlap. Fire trucks will be responding going in one direction, patrol cars are heading to another call going somewhere else, and an ambulance is racing to an emergency room. This is not uncommon. They need to get around traffic and not only are the normal sirens on, but of course they use the extra sirens to gain attention. This never shows up in sound studies does it. No.

Your ideas as to have a quiet, serene place for a resident to relax downtown will not happen. Look at all the construction in the area and how much noise that creates. The new community center soon breaks ground. The Fremont Bank building comes down and that whole site becomes a multi-year construction zone. The new apartment complex will take two years. All of this has major noise.

Trash trucks show up at odd hours during the day. Delivery trucks are always in and out. Businesses always have activity. The new community center will have events, parties, concerts, etc. This is all loud. It's a busy location. The walls for these temporary buildings will be thin. The roof is thin. There will be inexpensively installed windows and doors. There is no way that anyone will have a good nights sleep. It's going to be impossible. And if you think otherwise, I'd invite you to spend a few nights in your car downtown and experience this for yourself. You'll get it.

Some of the scientific studies showing certain noise impacts are flawed. While sound is often measured from a busy road and highways, I can guarantee you that there is no data accounting for sirens, trash and delivery trucks,


construction activity, and noises from concerts and other joyous events. White noise from a highway or roadway would be a welcome change.

Property values and if they will suffer as a result.

This subject doesn't need a lengthy paragraph. Buying and moving into a home is for people. Feelings make up the most substantial part in the decision making process. Numbers can be justified, yet emotions can run too strong to easily be overcome. Go talk to the sales staff at Locale, or any other community that's currently selling. Talk to me more about this, or any other agent who's familiar with the area and get their feedback. It's not a market today where there are lines and lotteries.

This letter could be longer. Discussion points can be further expounded upon. I could write this with more finesse and with more eloquence. However I'll stop for now. I can speak with any of you in more length anytime.

Dear Honorable Mayor, City Council and City Staff,

We write this letter as a major developer of "Downtown Fremont On the Rise" to voice our strenuous opposition to Site G, Downtown, as the site for the proposed Housing Navigation Center (HNC) for the homeless.

We believe that Site G, specifically the Parking Lot at City Hall, is totally unsuitable for the proposed HNC. We believe its presence in the heart of Fremont is inconsistent with the City's vision for the Downtown and will detract from our development efforts to revitalize the neighborhood.

While we share the City's concerns on homelessness, we have serious reservations about the City's decision-making process which has lacked robust community inputs. Disappointingly, we learned that the HNC's possible impacts to the Downtown redevelopment efforts were not considered with sufficient depth when the City whittled down the number of possible HNC sites. That oversight is significant, as the selection of any HNC site cannot be decided in isolation without considering its impacts to other City issues of equal importance.

Fremont's Downtown is an area which we, as a developer, already have and are further prepared to invest heavily to make it come to life in full consonance with the City's own Downtown Community Plan. Please note that a portion of the Downtown Community Plan's Foreword states that "The City intends to reward new developments... with streamlined approval processes... and other incentives to make development both economically feasible but also highly desirable." A Housing Navigation Center located in Downtown will certainly create a huge obstacle to the viability of financing and developing new housing in the Downtown Plan.

We trust the City to partner with us in delivering on the Downtown Plan. We presume that the trust goes both ways and that the City will not select Site G Downtown for the HNC.

We respectfully request that you include this letter as part of your review and decision-making process. We would also welcome an in-person meeting at your convenience to further discuss this matter.
