

<h2>WHO</h2>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Every adult, child, and baby living in the United States! • 1 Census form should be completed for <u>all</u> residents at each mailing address
<h2>WHAT</h2>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The United States constitution requires all residents to be counted every 10 years • The questionnaire will take 12 minutes to complete. It asks nine questions about: address, race, age, and relationship to the other residents at the address, etc.
<h2>WHEN</h2>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Census 2020 begins in mid-March 2020 • Starting May 2020, Census workers will begin going door-to-door to addresses who have not completed the Census to ask them to respond
