In the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic, we know that working class families, renters, and the homeless will be hit the hardest, health-wise and economically. Governor Newsom's executive order to protect renters and homeowners provides no enforceable protections to tenants where there is not a locally adopted ordinance. Fremont City Council has a responsibility to enact an immediate eviction moratorium for all tenants in Fremont who cannot pay rent due to loss of work or wages. This protection must be extended to all tenants, regardless of their type of work, immigration status, or source of income. The city should suspend enforcement of RV parking regulations to prevent further homelessness and strongly consider emergency shelter options for quarantining the homeless population, all of whom are high risk. My name is Lauren Hepler, and I'm a reporter covering the tech workforce for Protocol, a new tech-focused offshoot of Politico. I previously covered the Bay Area for the Silicon Valley Business Journal, the New York Times and others.

I've been reporting on COVID-19 and have reached out to the county sheriff's and public health department after yesterday's shelter-in-place order, but given that local police chiefs are also given enforcement power in the county order, I wanted to see whether the city is monitoring Tesla's ongoing factory operations?
