In the spirit of transparency in government and a bona fide attempt to build trust in local Fremont government, I request the City website be updated and the opportunity to speak at a Fremont City council meeting be clarified to represent the actual policies on these matters.

I request the City disclose they feel no moral or legal inclination to respond, read or investigate any concerns constituents may have in submitting any type of written or oral communications for consideration by the City of Fremont's elected and hired representatives. Additionally, clarify the completely ineffectual and comically limited "right" to address the council by submitting speaker cards at the meetings for that 60 second appeal that someone felt important enough to go out of their way (and not paid to do so) because of their concern for proper behavior from the local administration and save everyone some time!

I request you try to instill some tiny degree of integrity to the City of Fremont by disclosing the simple truth to your constituents and residents that you have absolutely no interest in hearing or investigating any concerns or notifications of inappropriate and/or unlawful actions on the part of our local government as experienced firsthand or as supported by facts, especially apparent in cases where the damage has already been done by the City without warning or authority.

I believe this will decrease the frustration and animosity being instilled unnecessarily in so many citizens. Another plus, it will save some time for the Council Members and staff by eliminating those absurd 60 second time slots so generously provided but ultimately misguided opportunities in the hopes of getting any responsible action on the part of the council and City employees.

I have spent two years writing letters, sending emails, requesting appointments, providing documentation on the complete mismanagement and illegal handling of a simple maintenance program on Rancho Arroyo Parkway and have NEVER received a response or acknowledgement that anything I ever submitted was even received. The City does not even answer questions within the requested response time, or address the actual questions submitted by my attorney on my behalf in this matter. There was a time I thought the personal appeals at council meetings were still useful for creating a paper trail, but imagine my surprise when I looked back at the minutes to find often my position on an issue was not even

noted, merely noting I had made comments. And of course, my request for correction to the minutes went, yes, that's right, completely ignored.

So, if the City is interested in building (well, creating) public trust here's a plan; please start by posting a transparent and accurate policy on your website and at your meetings and let people know that letters, concerns, or public addresses to the Council are not welcome and will not be used in any form of decision making on the local governments' behalf,

You might also think to discontinue any "open government" input nonsense to spare our residents the heartbreak when they realize you have absolutely no intention of being influenced by facts or firsthand knowledge of local issues, but I digress.




It is time for you to stand up and disregard his un-American, unscientific and unconstitutional decrees.

Here is our true reality in Alameda: 152 hospitalized positive patients; 52 ICU patients with 144 available ICU beds. These 204 positive patients are out of a population of 1.6 million Alameda residents. That is under 0.2% positive hospitalized patients. The majority of all positive cases recover with no serious complications or lingering health issues. That is the reality and it is a positive thing.

Total deaths as of 7/13 were at 152 of which 79 came from Skilled Nursing Facilities (SNF). That is 51% from the SNFs. Why aren't they being protected by the Alameda H.O.? A large majority of the remaining 73 came for the elderly of 61 and over. Clearly, our Governor and Alameda H.O. know where to focus effort and resources. Why aren't they doing that instead of focusing on restricting the young and health?

Given these factual data elements, why should Alameda not move forward in getting our lives back to normal?

In fact, at Friday's Special Fremont Unified School District Board Meeting, July 10, 2020, the FUSD Board of Education provided direction to start the 2020-21 school year under a distance learning model. This is in clear conflict with the science. Additionally, many countries have opened their schools with no significant issues. A recent commentary published in the journal Pediatrics, the official peer-reviewed journal of the American Academy of Pediatrics, concludes that children infrequently transmit Covid-19 to each other or to adults and that many schools, provided they follow appropriate social distancing guidelines and take into account rates of transmission in their community, can and should reopen in the fall. Why isn't the FUSD following the data and science? Parents need to be vocal and not allow this foolish policy harm their children's health and wellbeing. The parents need support from their Mayor and councilmembers. If not, I would recommend suing FUSD. We are starting to make our voices heard, be it against the “defund the police” push by the quixotic youth or the attempted stifling of our 4th of July celebration. Our city is a melting pot of local and immigrant citizens. Those citizens who are 1st generation, 2nd generation immigrants understand totalitarian and socialist regimes. They left their home of their birth to come to our Nation and form of government. They understand that our democracy is something special and worth fighting for more than those who have been born here and become complacent and lazy. Democracy requires work and attention.
