Thank you for addressing this issue. I support having locations where they can park that provide trash and sanitation. However I do NOT support the parking on city streets when they dump their trash and create a health hazard. These need to be removed. If they are unable to be good neighbors, it becomes a quality of life issue for the rest of us. This is not acceptable and should be eliminated.

If you go ahead I would recommend a 6-month trial with updates to the council every three months as long as the program continues. The update should include the number of people utilizing the program, length of time they utilize it, plus the number of problems both at the location and crime associated with the people living there. The crime report is important because we're always hear about the crime they cause, but it is important to understand what the reality is, good or bad. Most of these are the working poor who just need a space to catch up. But the bad apples need too be removed if the residents are going to support the program.
